**FINDINGS AND DECISION**

The duly constituted Electoral Board, consisting of Board of Election Commissioners of the City of Chicago Commissioners Langdon D. Neal and Richard A. Cowen, organized by law in response to a Call issued by Langdon D. Neal, Chairman of said Electoral Board, for the purpose of hearing and passing upon objections (“Objections”) of GEOFFREY LEAK (“Objector”) to the nomination papers (“Nomination Papers”) of BOBBY JOE JOHNSON, candidate for the office of Alderman of the Sixth Ward in the City of Chicago (“Candidate”) to be elected at the Municipal General Election to be held on February 27, 2007, having convened on January 2, 2007, at 10:00 a.m., in Room 800, 69 West Washington Street, Chicago Illinois, and having heard and determined the Objections to the Nomination Papers in the above-entitled matter, finds that:

1. Objections to the Nomination Papers of the Candidate herein were duly and timely filed.
2. The said Electoral Board has been legally constituted according to the laws of the State of Illinois.

3. A Call to the hearing on said Objections was duly issued by the Chairman of the Electoral Board and served upon the members of the Electoral Board, the Objector and the Candidate, by registered or certified mail and by Sheriff's service, as provided by statute.

4. A public hearing held on these Objections commenced on January 2, 2007 and was continued from time to time.

5. The Electoral Board assigned this matter to Hearing Examiner Ernesto Borges, Jr. for further hearings and proceedings.

6. The Objector and the Candidate were directed by the Electoral Board to appear before the Hearing Examiner on the date and at the time designated in the Hearing Schedule. The following persons, among others, were present at such hearing: the Objector, GEOFFREY LEAK, by counsel, Mark Hamilton; and the Candidate, BOBBY JOE JOHNSON, pro se.

7. The Hearing Examiner ordered that an examination of the registration records be conducted by its clerks and agents under the Board's direction and supervision, in accordance with the laws of Illinois and the rules of the Board.

8. The Hearing Examiner directed all parties to appear and be present, either personally and/or by their authorized representatives during this records examination.

9. The Candidate and/or his duly authorized representative was present during the examination of the registration records.

10. The Objector and/or his duly authorized representative was present during the examination of the registration records.

11. The examination of the registration records was completed and the Electoral Board hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the results of the records examination conducted by its clerks and agents. The written report of the result of the registration records

examination is contained in the Electoral Board's file in this case and a copy has been provided to the parties.

12. The Electoral Board has considered all evidence and arguments tendered by the parties and the Hearing Examiner's report of recommended findings and conclusions of law.

13. The results of the records examination indicate that:

A. The minimum number of valid signatures required by law for placement on the ballot for the office in question is 254;

B. The number of purportedly valid signatures appearing on the nominating petition filed by the Candidate total 506;

C. The number of signatures deemed invalid because of objections sustained as a result of the records examination total 256;

D. The remaining number of signatures deemed valid as a result of the records examination total 250.

14. The Hearing Examiner then set a hearing to allow the Candidate an opportunity to present evidence in support of his Rule 8 motion objecting to the Board's clerk's findings during the records examination. The Candidate failed to file any motions pursuant to Rule 7 or Rule 8.

15. Based upon the evidence presented, the Hearing Examiner found that the Candidate's Nomination Papers contained only 250 valid signatures and that the Candidate's Nomination Papers should be found invalid.

16. The Electoral Board finds that the number of valid signatures appearing on the Candidate's nominating petition following completion of the records examination is less than the minimum number of valid signatures required by law to be placed upon the official ballot as a candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago.





17. For the reasons stated above, the Electoral Board sustains the Objections and finds that the Nomination Papers of BOBBY JOE JOHNSON are not valid.

18. The Electoral Board further finds that objections were filed against the Candidate's Nomination Papers in case 07-EB-ALD-030 and that the objections in that case were also sustained and the Candidate's Nomination Papers declared invalid.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Objections of GEOFFREY LEAK to the Nomination Papers of BOBBY JOE JOHNSON, candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago are hereby SUSTAINED and said Nomination Papers are hereby declared INVALID and the name of BOBBY JOE JOHNSON, candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago, SHALL NOT be printed on the official ballot for the Municipal General Election to be held on February 27, 2007.
