FINDINGS AND DECISION

The duly constituted Electoral Board, consisting of Board of Election Commissioners of the City of Chicago Commissioners Langdon D. Neal and Richard A. Cowen, organized by law in response to a Call issued by Langdon D. Neal, Chairman of said Electoral Board for the purpose of hearing and passing upon objections ("Objections") of JAMES WILSON ("Objector") to the nomination papers ("Nomination Papers") of DARYL JONES, candidate for the office of Alderman of the Thirty-seventh Ward of the City of Chicago ("Candidate") to be elected at the Municipal General Elections to be held on February 27, 2007, having convened on January 2, 2007, at 10:00 a.m., in Room 800, 69 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois, and having heard and determined the Objections to the Nomination Papers in the above-entitled matter, finds that:

- 1. Objections to the Nomination Papers of the Candidate herein were duly and timely filed.
- 2. The said Electoral Board has been legally constituted according to the laws of the State of Illinois.

- 3. A Call to the hearing on said Objections was duly issued by the Chairman of the Electoral Board and served upon the members of the Electoral Board, the Objector and the Candidate, by registered or certified mail and by Sheriff's service, as provided by statute.
- 4. A public hearing held on these Objections commenced on January 2, 2007 and was continued from time to time.
- 5. The Electoral Board assigned this matter to Hearing Examiner Casandra Watson for further hearings and proceedings.
- 6. The Objector and the Candidate were directed by the Electoral Board's Call served upon them to appear before the Hearing Examiner on the date and at the time designated in the Call. The following persons, among others, were present at such hearing; the Objector, JAMES WILSON, by counsel; and the Candidate, DARYL JONES, *pro se*.
- 7. The Hearing Examiner ordered that a limited examination of the registration records be conducted by its clerks and agents under the Board's direction and supervision, in accordance with the laws of Illinois and the rules of the Board.
- 8. The Hearing Examiner directed all parties to appear and be present, either personally and/or by their authorized representatives during this records examination.
- 9. The Candidate and/or his duly authorized representative(s) was present during the examination of the registration records at all times.
- 10. The Objector and/or his duly authorized representative(s) was present during the examination of the registration records at all times.
- 11. The examination of the registration records of the Board was terminated after Board staff determined that the Candidate had at least 185 valid signatures on his petition. The minimum signature requirement is 150.

- 12. The Electoral Board has considered all evidence and arguments tendered by the parties.
- 13. The Electoral Board finds that the Candidate has a sufficient number of valid signatures on his Nomination Papers to be placed upon the ballot as a candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the Thirty-seventh Ward of the City of Chicago.
- 14. The Electoral Board overrules the Objections and finds that the Candidate's Nomination Papers are valid.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Objections of JAMES WILSON to the Nomination Papers of DARYL JONES, candidate for the office of Alderman of the Thirty-seventh Ward of the City of Chicago, are hereby OVERRULED and said Nomination Papers are hereby declared VALID and the name of DARYL JONES, candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the Thirty-seventh Ward of the City of Chicago, SHALL be printed on the ballot for the Municipal General Election to be held on February 27, 2007.
