**FINDINGS AND DECISION**

The duly constituted Electoral Board, consisting of Board of Election Commissioners of the City of Chicago Commissioners Langdon D. Neal, Richard A. Cowen and Marisel A. Hernandez, organized by law in response to a Call issued by Langdon D. Neal, Chairman of said Electoral Board, for the purpose of hearing and passing upon objections (“Objections”) of John V. Moore (“Objector(s)”) to the nomination papers (“Nomination Papers”) of Al Hofeld, Jr., candidate for the nomination of the Democratic Party for the office of State Senator, 13th Legislative District, State of Illinois (“Candidate”), to be nominated at the General Primary Election to be held February 2, 2010, having convened on November 16, 2009 at 10:00 a.m., in Room 800, 69 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois, and having heard and determined the Objections to the Nomination Papers in the above-entitled matter, finds that:

1. Objections to the Nomination Papers of the Candidate herein were duly and timely filed.

2. The said Electoral Board has been legally constituted according to the laws of the State of Illinois.

3. A Call to the hearing on said Objections was duly issued by the Chairman of the Electoral Board and served upon the members of the Electoral Board, the Objector(s) and the Candidate, by registered or certified mail and by Sheriff's service, as provided by statute.

4. A public hearing held on these Objections commenced on November 16, 2009 at 10:00 a.m.


5. The Electoral Board assigned this matter to Hearing Officer Frank A. Tedesso for further hearings and proceedings.

6. The Objector and the Candidate were directed by the Electoral Board's Call served upon them to appear before the Hearing Officer on the date and at the time designated in the Call. The following persons, among others, were present at such hearing: the Objector, John V. Moore, by counsel, Michael J. Kasper; and the Candidate, Al Hofeld, Jr., by counsel, James P. Nally PC.

7. The Board finds that on December 7, 2009, the Candidate filed papers with the State Board of Elections withdrawing as a candidate and requesting that his name not be printed upon the ballot, thus rendering the Objections moot.




