## **FINDINGS AND DECISION**

The duly constituted Electoral Board, consisting of Board of Election Commissioners of the City of Chicago Commissioners Langdon D. Neal, Richard A. Cowen, and Marisel A. Hernandez, organized by law in response to a Call issued by Langdon D. Neal, Chairman of said Electoral Board, for the purpose of hearing and passing upon objections ("Objections") of Nicholas Scalise ("Objector") to the nomination papers ("Nomination Papers") of Fred Christie, candidate for the office of Alderman of the 43rd Ward of the City of Chicago ("Candidate") to be elected at the Municipal General Election to be held on February 22, 2011, having convened on December 6, 2010, at 9:00 a.m., in Room 800, 69 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois, and having heard and determined the Objections to the Nomination Papers in the above-entitled matter, finds that:

- 1. Objections to the Nomination Papers of the Candidate herein were duly and timely filed.
- 2. The said Electoral Board has been legally constituted according to the laws of the State of Illinois.

- 3. A Call to the hearing on said Objections was duly issued by the Chairman of the Electoral Board and served upon the members of the Electoral Board, the Objector and the Candidate, by registered or certified mail and by Sheriff's service, as provided by statute.
- 4. A public hearing held on these Objections commenced on December 6, 2010 and was continued from time to time.
- 5. The Electoral Board assigned this matter to Hearing Officer Rodney W. Stewart for further hearings and proceedings.
- 6. The Objector and the Candidate were directed by the Electoral Board to appear before the Hearing Officer on the date and at the time designated in the Hearing Schedule. On such date and time, the Hearing Officer called the case by calling aloud the case number, the name of the Objector and the name of the Candidate. The following persons, among others, answered and were present at such hearing: the Objector, Nicholas Scalise, by attorney Nicholas C. Kefalos.
- 7. The Candidate, Fred Christie, did not answer to the call nor did he appear at the hearing. The case was called again at least two more times at least 15 minutes apart on December 6, 2010 and at no time did the Candidate or any person purporting to represent the Candidate appear.
  - 8. The matter was continued for hearing to December 14, 2010.
- 9. The Electoral Board finds that the Candidate was served with a copy of the Objector's Petition and with a copy of the Call on December 13, 2010.
- 10. The Electoral Board finds that the Candidate, Fred Christie, did not appear at any of the duly called meetings and hearings conducted in this matter after having been served with a copy of the Call and the Objector's Petition by the means of service specified in the statute.

- 11. The Electoral Board further finds that the Objector's petition, on its face, contains sufficient allegations, if accepted as true, to invalidate the Candidate's Nomination Papers.
- 12. Therefore, the Electoral Board finds that the Candidate, Fred Christie, is in default, that the Objections are sustained, and that the Candidate's Nomination Papers are invalid. The Candidate was also defaulted in 11-EB-ALD-316.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Objections of Nicholas Scalise to the Nomination Papers of Fred Christie, candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the 43rd Ward of the City of Chicago, are hereby SUSTAINED and said Nomination Papers are hereby declared INVALID and the name of Fred Christie, candidate for election to the office of Alderman of the 43rd Ward of the City of Chicago, SHALL NOT be printed on the official ballot for the Municipal General Election to be held on February 22, 2011.
