## ALDERPERSON CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

## FOR THE FEBRUARY 28, 2023, CHICAGO ELECTIONS FOLLOWING THE CITY COUNCIL'S 2022 WARD REDISTRICTING

"In the election following redistricting, a candidate for alderperson may be elected from any ward containing a part of the ward in which he or she resided for at least one year next preceding the election that follows the redistricting, and, if elected, that person may be reelected from the new ward he or she represents if he or she resides in that ward for at least one year next preceding the reelection." 65 ILCS 20/21-14(a).
