DECISION

The duly constituted Municipal Officers Electoral Board, consisting of NIKKI M. ZOLLAR, JAMES R. NOLAN AND MICHAEL J. HAMBLET, organized by law in response to a Call issued by NIKKI M. ZOLLAR, Chairman of said Electoral Board, for the purpose of hearing and passing upon Objections to Nominating Petitions for the Offices of Mayor of the City of Chicago and Alderman of the 6th ward of the City of Chicago, having convened on December 30, 1988 at 10:00 a.m. in the viewing gallery of the City Council Chambers, Chicago, Illinois; and having heard and determined the objections to the petition in the above entitled matter find that:

- The said Electoral Board has been legally constituted according to the laws of the State of Illinois;
- Objections to the nominating petition of the candidate herein were duly filed;

- 3. A call to the hearing on said objections was duly issued and was served upon the members of the Municipal Officers Electoral Board, the Objector and the Candidate by mail and by personal service as provided by statute;
- 4. A public hearing was held on these objections commencing on December 30, 1988;
- 5. The following persons, among others, were present at such hearings: the members of the Electoral Board, the Objector, pro se, and the Candidate pro se;
- 6. The Board having heard and considered all evidence and arguments tendered by those appearing at the hearing;
- 7. The Board having ordered an examination of the precinct binders to be conducted by its clerks and agents under the Board's direction and supervision, in accordance with the laws of Illinois and the rules of the Board;
- 8. During examination of the precinct binders, the Board directed all parties to appear and be present, either personally and/or by their authorized representatives, duly appointed and authorized by said parties;
- 9. The Candidate and/or his duly authorized representatives having been present during the examination of the binders at all times;
- 10. The Objector and/or his duly authorized representatives having been present during the examination of the binders at all times;
- 11. Examination of the precinct binders was terminated by agreement of the parties;
- 12. The Board finds that:

The number of valid signatures on the nominating petition falls below the minimum number of signatures required by law to be placed upon the ballot as candidate for nomination to the office of Mayor of the City of Chicago, Republican party.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the objections of Richard D. Murphy to the nominating petition of Jon Silverstein, candidate for election to the office of Mayor, of the City of Chicago, Republican party, are hereby sustained and said petition is hereby declared invalid and the name of Jon Silverstein, candidate for election to the office of Mayor of the City of

Chicago, Republican party, shall not be printed on the Republican ballot for the Special Mayoral Primary Election to be held on February 28, 1989.
