## Special Parking for Voters with Disabilities

For the April 7 Supplementary (Run-Off) Elections, voters with disabilities will be provided with parking in front of their polling places.

In cooperation with the city's Department of Streets and Sanitation, the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners is arranging to provide two marked parking spaces for the disabled in front of every polling place in each of the city's 50 Chicago wards.

In this massive undertaking, Streets and Sanitation marks spaces for more than 1,700 Chicago polling locations for the city's 2,069 precincts.

Chicago Election Chairman Langdon D. Neal said that reserved parking signs will be in effect from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. for Election Day. Crews from the Department of Streets and Sanitation will post the signs prior to Election Day.

Chairman Neal praised the Department of Streets and Sanitation, and Commissioner Charles L. Williams, for the department's assistance in this important accessibility program, now in its 11th year.
