March 10 is Last Day to Register Online or By Mail

Voters who need to register for the first time or file name or address updates have until 11:59 p.m. on Tues., March 10 to act and be eligible to vote in their home precincts or vote by mail at the April 7 run-off elections.

Chicago voters who already are registered at their current addresses need not act. Voters may verify their registration status by using the Election Board's "[Your Voter Information](#)" system at chicagoelections.com.

Those who need to register for the first time or update their registrations have these options:

- (1) [The online registration system](#) will be available through 11:59 p.m. on Tues., March 10. Voters must have a valid Illinois driver's license or state ID to use the online system.
- (2) The Chicago Election Board will provide special hours for last-minute, in-person voter registration at 69 W. Washington St.:
 - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mon., March 9
 - 8 a.m. thru 11:59 p.m. on Tues., March 10
- (3) The [mail-in form](#) is available at chicagoelections.com. This form will be accepted and processed if postmarked on or before March 10.

In-person registration will be available through the Grace Period program from March 11 through Sat., April 4. During the Grace Period, voters need to come in person to a designated site, present two forms of ID (at least one of which shows the voter's current address), and be ready to cast a ballot during that same visit.

To register to vote, a person must be: a U.S. citizen; at least 18 years of age by Election Day; and be a resident of the precinct at least 30 days before the election.

Note: Under current state law, Election Day Registration will not be offered at the April 7 elections.
